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this book addresses the implications of artificial intelligence for teaching learning and academic integrity in higher education it explores policies about the use of generative

artificial intelligence genai describes how to teach writing in the era of genai and how instructors can design courses and assessments that prevent plagiarism while building the necessary skills for critical thinking and writing together the chapters include research results case studies teaching methodologies course design ideas analysis of power and gatekeeping and best practices related to gai from a diverse range of researchers from english and french canada the united states england ukraine and croatia the authors approach the advent and rapid spread of genai in higher education by examining its use from different perspectives with a particular focus on its impact on academic integrity taking a communication studies approach consideration is given to the role genai might play disrupting power structures in universities to improve access for students who are non traditional or english language learners the book also explores how reimagining teaching methodologies can help to mitigate academic integrity violations due to misuse of genai and to teach students to use genai with integrity as a research and brainstorming tool students need to learn how to assess the reliability of genai s output as the develop the skills for research and writing methods of teaching writing and research skills using genai are explored in an effort to ensure that critical thinking skills are developed successfully most instructors who use writing intensive assessments believe that essential critical thinking skills are developed via the writing process often ideas become concrete as one writes about them teaching with genai can provide opportunities for instructors to guide their students into a deeper analysis and critique of their research

implementing systematic diversity transformation requires embracing all aspects of diversity gender sexual orientation disability gender identification and other salient characteristics of difference as well as race and ethnicity this book lays out a framework for a systematic and sustained diversity process that first recognizes that too many diversity initiatives have generated more statements of intent than actual change and that audits conducted by outside bodies frequently fail to achieve buy in or long term impact and are costly endeavors the authors framework identifies nine dimensions that need to be addressed to achieve a comprehensive audit that leads to action describes the underlying research based practices and offers guidance on ensuring that all relevant voices are heard the process is designed to be implemented by and within the institution saving the considerable expense of outside consulting and design in addition it offers flexibility in the timing and sequence of implementation and provides the means for each institution to interrogate its unique circumstances context and practices this book provides a concrete process for data gathering analysis and evaluation of institution wide diversity efforts through a progressive modular approach to diversity transformation it gives campuses the ability to audit evaluate and analyze diversity progress on the nine dimensions and prioritize areas of focus its systematic research based approach supports continuous improvement and proactively addresses accreditation criteria the book is designed as a collaborative tool that will enable every

constituency on campus from boards of trustees presidents provosts executive officers diversity officers deans department heads and chairs administrators hr officers faculty senates and staff councils diversity taskforces multicultural centers faculty and researchers to identify processes and relationships that need to change and implement practices that value and support the diversity on their campuses and undertake the transformation necessary for institutional success in a changing world the questions and guidelines set out in this book will enable all stakeholders to audit the progress on each diversity dimension identify gaps between research based practices and current approaches tie diversity benchmarks to accreditation frameworks and strategic plans chart the organization s overall progress in the development of comprehensive diversity initiatives leading toward inclusive excellence prioritize institutional diversity initiatives based upon a comparison of the current state and the desired state availability of resources and the importance of each dimension in relation to institutional diversity goals create a long term strategy for diversity transformation that provides a concrete research based method for auditing progress and future planning

recent years have seen the strengthening of a discourse that emphasises the virtues of markets competition and private initiative vis à vis the vices of public intervention in higher education this volume presents a timely reflection about the effects this increasing marketization has been producing in many higher education systems worldwide the various chapters of this volume analyse the impact of markets at the system level with significant attention being devoted to the changes in modes of regulation the strengthening of aspects such as privatization and inter institutional competition in higher education systems and the closer interaction between higher education and its economic environment several of the contributors devote attention as well to the implications of market forces for institutional change notably regarding issues such as mission organizational structure and governance and the way marketization is affecting the internal distribution of power and the definition of priorities finally the volume includes several chapters focusing on the different markets of higher education such as the academic labour market undergraduate and postgraduate education and research markets altogether these chapters provide important insights concerning the many national and institutional contexts in which the marketization of higher education has been taking place around the world

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focusing on gender and culture the authors explore the leadership tactics and strategies university presidents use to uplift the university from a regional campus to a tier 1 research powerhouse offering strategies anecdotes and transferable methods for university leaders to elevate their institution and thrive in the academic market
